**Environment Department Lifts Mandatory Boil Water Advisory
for Bonita Park Nazarene Conference Center
and Precautionary Boil Water in Little Bear Fire Burn Area**

*Mandatory Boil Water Remains in Effect for
Ski Apache and Villa Madonna*

(Santa Fe, N.M.) – The New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) has lifted the mandatory boil water advisory for the Bonita Park Nazarene Conference Center in the Little Bear Fire Burn area. Recent drinking water sample results indicate that the water quality was not compromised by the fire. The NMED has also lifted the precautionary boil water advisory issued for water systems in the Little Bear Fire burn area. The NMED has inspected damaged or compromised systems in areas that have been reopened to evacuees and will continue to monitor water quality. Boil water advisories will be issued as warranted.

The following NMED **mandatory** boil water advisories remain in effect:

- Ski Apache
- Villa Madonna

The water system consumers of Ski Apache and Villa Madonna are advised to seek an alternate source of drinking water, such as bottled water, or boil the water for five minutes before drinking, cooking, and dishwashing.
