NMED Lifts “Boil Water Alert” for North Cleveland MDWCA in Mora County

(Santa Fe, NM) –The New Mexico Environment Department’s Drinking Water Bureau advised the North Cleveland Mutual Domestic Water Consumers Association to lift a “boil water order” for its water system.

NMED issued the order after bacteriological contamination that exceeded the Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for E. coli was discovered in drinking water from the water system. NMED required the North Cleveland MDWCA in Mora County to notify its consumers of the finding.

Actions to disinfect the water system and identify possible sources of contamination were promptly taken. These actions included shock chlorination and flushing of the water system. Consumers were advised to boil all water prior to ingestion.

Water samples collected since the shock chlorination and flushing have shown no E. coli present in the water system. These results have allowed NMED’s Drinking Water Bureau to advise the North Cleveland MDWCA to lift the “boil water order” for its water system.

The presence of E. coli in water indicates that the water may have been in contact with sewage or animal wastes, and could contain disease-causing organisms. Most strains of E. coli are harmless and live in the intestines of healthy humans and animals. However, a positive test for E. coli in the drinking water supply may indicate the presence of dangerous strains of E. coli or other disease-causing organisms, which are sometimes found in sewage or animal wastes. These types of organisms may cause severe gastrointestinal illness and, in rare cases, even death. Children, the elderly and immuno-compromised individuals are at an increased risk for illness.
