Air Quality Operating Permit for Targa - Monument Gas Plant of Versado Gas Processors, LLC

Versado Gas Processors, LLC at 6 Desta Drive, Suite 3300; Midland, TX 79705 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Targa - Monument Gas Plant. The owner of this plant is Versado Gas Processors, LLC. The exact location of the facility is at latitude 32 deg, 36 min, 37.8 sec and longitude -103 deg, 18 min, 43.7 sec; Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 2.8 miles west of Monument in Lea County, New Mexico. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P110-R3 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 610.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of the facility is to process natural gas through inlet separation, an amine system for acid gas removal (carbon dioxide and hydrogen sulfide), dehydration for water removal, and the separation of methane from natural gas liquids (NGL). This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Hence, per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves updating the Operating Permit to incorporate revisions in construction permits since the previous full Title V permit (issued Jan. 9, 2019). This incorporation will involve one construction technical revision (110-M9R3) and one significant revision (110-M10).

The estimated maximum air pollutant emissions to the atmosphere, from this facility after the requested operating permit is issued, are as follows: Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 1019.1 tpy; Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 345.1 tpy; Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 133.7 tpy; Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 911.0 tpy; Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 27.7 tpy, Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 15.2 tpy; Hydrogen Sulfide (H2S) at 14.7 tpy; and greenhouse gas (CO₂e) at 125,651 tpy. The facility is a major source of greenhouse gas emissions.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance. The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 7, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, and 77; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, GG, KKK, and OOOOa; and 40 CFR 64; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before April 12, 2020.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P110-R3 by contacting Jim Nellessen at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
