LEGAL NOTICE For <u>Air Quality Operating Permit</u> for Saunders Gas Plant of Versado Gas Processors, LLC

Versado Gas Processors, LLC at 6 Desta Drive Suite 3300; Midland, TX 79705 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for a modification of the air quality operating permit for its Saunders Gas Plant. The owner of this plant is Versado Gas Processors, LLC. The exact location of the facility is at latitude 33 deg, 3 min, 26.25 sec and longitude -103 deg, 36 min, 27.1 sec. To reach the location of this facility, travel west from Lovington for 11 miles on Highway 82, then turn north onto Highway 457. Continue approximately 11 miles; the facility is on the west side of the road. This facility is located approximately 15 miles northwest of Lovington in Lea County, New Mexico. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P111R3 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 612.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of the facility is to remove hydrogen sulfide, carbon dioxide, and water from natural gas and recover natural gas liquids (NGL's) from the inlet gas stream. The facility sells both the gas and natural gas liquids via pipeline.

This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. There are no changes to the existing air emission limits in this permitting action shown below.

Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 1815 tons per year (tpy); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 259 tpy; Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 109 tpy; Sulfur Dioxide (SO2) at 1447 tpy; Total Suspended Particulate Matter (TSP) at 25.2 tpy, Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM10) at 24.7 tpy, and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM2.5) at 24.6 tpy, Hydrogen Sulfide at 6 tpy, and greenhouse gas (CO2e) of 111,330 tpy. The facility is a major source of greenhouse gas emissions.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 1, 7, 35, 38, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 77, and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, 60.18, KKK, and LLL; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A, ZZZZ, and DDDDD; 40 CFR 64 and 68; 40 CFR 82; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before July 26, 2020.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P111R3 by contacting Joseph Kimbrell at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
