<u>Air Quality Operating Permit</u> for Harvest - Horse Canyon Central Delivery Point of Harvest Four Corners LLC

Harvest Four Corners LLC at 1755 Arroyo Dr; Bloomfield, NM 87413 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Harvest - Horse Canyon Central Delivery Point. The owner of this plant is Harvest Four Corners LLC. The exact location of the facility is latitude 36 deg, 47 min, 14 sec and longitude -107 deg, 45 min, 37 sec Datum: NAD83. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is approximately ten (10) miles east southeast of Aztec in San Juan County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P035-R4 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 1274.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. operation.

The function of the facility is to remove water and heavy hydrocarbon liquids (condensate), dehydrate, and recompress field gas for pipeline transmission. The facility also performs separation of waste water and used oil collected from other nearby field production facilities.

This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves renewal of the facility's Title V operating permit.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 0868-M6-R2 and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit – P035-R3. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 142.8 tpy (-40.3); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 250.1 tpy (-71.5); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 150.7 tpy (-26.5); Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 0.2 tpy (+0.2); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 3.3 tpy (-0.9), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 3.3 tpy (-0.9),; and greenhouse gas (CO₂e) > 75,000 tpy.

The facility is a minor (< 100,000 tpy CO₂e) source of greenhouse gas emissions.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 1, 3, 7, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 77 and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A and potentially JJJJ; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A and HH; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before 11/19/2020.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P035-R4 by contacting Rebecca Procter at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.

Due to the public health emergency order, certain NMED offices are closed to the public.
