## Concise Explanatory Statement For Rulemaking Adoption:

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Findings required for rulemaking adoption:

**Findings MUST include:** 

- Reasons for adopting rule, including any findings otherwise required by law of the agency, and a summary of any independent analysis done by the agency;
- Reasons for any change between the published proposed rule and the final rule; and
- Reasons for not accepting substantive arguments made through public comment.

The Environmental Improvement Board ("Board") is authorized to adopt Part 101 pursuant to the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act, NMSA 1978, Sections 74-2-1 to -17 ("AQCA"). Section 74-2-5 (A) of the AQCA broadly provides that the Board "shall prevent or abate air pollution." Section 74-2-5(B)(1) states that the Board shall "adopt, promulgate, publish, amend, and repeal rules and standards consistent with the Air Quality Control Act to attain and maintain national ambient air quality standards and prevent or abate air pollution. NMSA 1978, § 74-2-2(B).

"Air contaminant" is defined as "a substance, including any particulate matter, fly ash, dust, fumes, gas, mist, smoke, vapor, micro-organisms, radioactive material, any combination thereof or any decay or reaction product thereof." NMSA 1978, § 74-2-2(A). Section 74-2-5(B)(1)(b) expressly mandates that the Board adopt, "Standards of performance that limit carbon dioxide emissions to no more than one thousand one hundred pounds per megawatt-hour on and after January 1, 2023 for a new or existing source that is an electric generating facility with an original installed capacity exceeding three hundred megawatts and that uses coal as a fuel source."

Like its authorizing statute, Part 101 is aimed at addressing carbon dioxide emissions from the power sector that contribute to greenhouse gas concentrations. Generating electricity from burning coal results in the release of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere. Carbon dioxide is an air pollutant under the definition set forth in the AQCA, and is a regulated greenhouse gas. The emissions standards, monitoring, recordkeeping and reporting requirements in Part 101 will reduce anthropogenic carbon dioxide emissions from this sector in New Mexico.

The Board adopted provisions that were not included in the proposed rule. These changes were proposed by parties that provided technical testimony to support their argument at the hearing. The changes comprise compliance determination parameters including the use of net generation instead of gross generation and using a 365-operating-day rolling average instead of 12 operating-month time frame. Conforming changes to the rule were also adopted.
