- 1. The second day of the meeting began by jumping right into the day's welcome with Jojo La from Colorado's Environmental Boards and Commission. In her welcome, Ms. La highlighted the knowledge and information shared on day 1. Kirby Olson, New Mexico Environment Department, and Abby Fulton, EPA Region 8, also provided welcomes and shared their gratitude for the presentations and discussions on day 1. Then Megan McCarthy, Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, and Mark Jones, New Mexico Environment Department, kicked off day 2.
- 2. After the welcome, the group started with a series of presentations and discussions on Four Corners air monitoring trends and analysis. The series of presentations started with a general overview of the Four Corners region by Suzy Apodaca, EPA Region 6. Will Vicars, Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, also provided an overview of monitoring in Colorado and New Mexico.

- 4. After the discussions on monitoring, a series of presentations were provided on air pollution health impacts and mitigation efforts. The presentations started with Abby Fulton, EPA, and Armando Paz, New Mexico Environment Department, on ozone and particulate matter (PM) health effects.
