Air Quality Operating Permit
for Chaparral Gas Plant of Enterprise Field Services, LLC

Enterprise Field Services, LLC at PO Box 4324; Houston, TX 772104324 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Chaparral Gas Plant. The owner of this plant is Enterprise Field Services LLC. The exact location of the facility is/will be at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 32.654183, -103.894872 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 12 mi SW of Loco Hills in Eddy County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P264R2 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 26896.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation.

The main purpose of the facility is to process natural gas for the removal of water, crude oil condensates, and carbon dioxide, and through fractionation extracts natural gas liquids (NGL) using cryogenic distillation. A parallel mechanical refrigeration process removes additional hydrocarbon liquids.

This operating permit application is for a Title V renewal of Enterprise Field Services, LLC (Enterprise) pursuant to 20.2.70.404.C(1)(a) NMAC. The permit incorporates NSR Construction Permit No. 3662-M9, issued on July 26, 2022, which authorized an increase to the permitted horsepower capacity of combustion engines E-1000, E-2000, and E-5000, and subsequent administrative revisions M9R1, M9R2, and M9R3 for engine-like replacements.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 3662M9 are brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit – P264-R1M1. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 200.8 tpy (+8.6); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 157.2 tpy (+7.9); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 281.1 tpy (+2.6); Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 10.1 tpy (+0.2); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 4.3 tpy (+0.2), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 3.61 tpy (+0.2); and greenhouse gas (CO₂e) > 75,000 tpy.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 1, 7, 38, 50, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77 and 82; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, JJJJ, KKK, and OOOO; 40 CFR 63 Subparts HH, ZZZZ, CCCCC; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before March 13, 2025.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
