## Air Quality Operating Permit for Red Hills Gas Processing Plant of Targa Northern Delaware LLC

Targa Northern Delaware LLC at PO Box 1689; Lovington, NM 88260 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its **Red Hills Gas Processing Plant**. The owner of this plant is Targa Northern Delaware LLC. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 32.210556, -103.523889 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 24 miles NW of Jal in Lea County, NM. This application file has been assigned an **Operating Permit Number P278-R1** and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 29885. Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation.

The main purpose of the facility is to dehydrate and remove CO<sub>2</sub> and natural gas liquids from sweet field gas for transportation in a sales pipeline.

This operating permit application is for permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves the incorporation of NSR actions 4310-M5R2 through 4310-M5R7.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 4310-M5 and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit – P278-R1. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 359.0 tpy (no change); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 444.2 tpy (no change); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 349.6 tpy (no change); Sulfur Dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>) at 422.8 tpy (no change); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM<sub>10</sub>) at 73.0 tpy (no change), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM<sub>2.5</sub>) at 59.3 tpy (no change); and greenhouse gas (CO<sub>2</sub>e) > 75,000 tpy.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 3, 7, 50, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 75, and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, Dc, JJJJ, OOOO, OOOOa, & OOOOb; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A, HH, ZZZZ, & DDDDD; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before February 20, 205.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
