Preliminary Determination for an Air Quality Permit for Versado Gas Processors, LLC

Versado Gas Processors, LLC, 6 Desta Drive Suite 3300, Midland, TX has submitted an air quality permit application to the Air Quality Bureau (AQB), New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality permit to modify Eunice Gas Processing Plant. The application file has been assigned Permit No. 0067-M8 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 609. The exact location of the facility is at latitude 32 degrees, 25 minutes, 28 seconds and longitude -103 degrees, 8 minutes, 50 seconds. To reach this facility, travel east on Texas Avenue from the intersection of N. Main Street and E. Texas Avenue in Eunice for about 0.7 miles and turn right on S. 4th Street. Travel for about 0.7 miles the facility will be at the end of the road. This facility is located approximately 1 mile SE of Eunice in Lea County, New Mexico.

The proposed modification will consist of permitting existing malfunction emissions to be released at both flares, removing a 1,000 gallon gasoline tank and installing a 2,800 gallon gasoline tank.

Total air pollutant emissions to the atmosphere are estimated to be approximately Nitrogen Oxides (NO_x) at 3167 tons per year (tpy); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 876 tpy; Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 251 tpy; Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 852 tpy; Total Suspended Particulate Matter (TSP) at 38 tpy, Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 24 tpy, and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 20 tpy, hydrogen sulfide at 14 tpy, and greenhouse gas (CO₂e) of 212,010 tpy. These emission estimates could change slightly during the course of the Department's review of the application.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. The preliminary review and applicant's analysis of ambient air quality impacts indicates that the facility's air emissions will meet the air quality standards for NO_x, CO, SO₂, TSP, PM₁₀, and PM_{2.5}. VOCs are a pre-cursor to ozone and the NMED does not require an individual ozone ambient impact analysis for each application. To determine compliance with national ambient air quality standards for ozone, NMED uses air monitors to monitor ozone concentrations. A full review will evaluate the estimated emission rates for the pollutants listed in this public notice and determine compliance with ambient air quality requirements and standards.

Based on the applicant's analysis, a preliminary determination is that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 3, 7, 35, 37, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 77, and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts KKK and OOOO; 40 CFR 63 Subparts HH, ZZZZ, DDDDD, and CCCCCC; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality permit on or before June 5, 2016. This source is a PSD major source according to 20.2.74 NMAC.

To ensure compliance with state and federal air regulations, the permit is expected to include conditions that limit the emissions and conditions that will require record keeping and reporting to the Department.

The permit application is available for review in electronic or hard copy at the Air Quality Bureau Office, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, New Mexico. All interested persons have thirty (30) days from the date this notice is published, to notify the Department in writing of their interest in the permit application. The written comments should refer to the company

name, facility name and Permit No. (or send a copy of this notice along with your comments). The written comments shall state the nature of the issues raised and how it relates to the requirements of applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. The written comments should be mailed to Kirby Olson, New Mexico Environment Dept., Air Quality Bureau, Permit Section, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816.

The Department will notify all persons, who have provided written comments as to when and where the Department's analysis may be reviewed. Although all written comments will be made part of the public record, any person who does not express interest in writing before the end of this first thirty (30) day period will not receive such notification.

If the Department receives written public comment before the end of the Department's thirty (30) day public notice, the Department's analysis will be made available for review for thirty (30) days at the NMED district or field office nearest to the source before the permit will be issued. Written comments on the analysis or permit application may be submitted to the Department during this second thirty (30) day period or at any time before the permit is issued or denied.
