Air Quality Operating Permit

for San Luis Pump Station of Mid-America Pipeline Company LLC

Mid-America Pipeline Company LLC; c/o Enterprise Products Operating, P.O. Box 4324, Houston, TX 77210-4324, has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its San Luis Pump Station. The owner of this plant is Mid-America Pipeline Company LLC. The exact location of the facility is at latitude 35 deg, 42 min, 17 sec, and longitude -107 deg, 6 min, 23 sec, Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 25 miles south south-west of Cuba, NM in Sandoval County. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P202-R3 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 1109.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of the facility is to transport refined petroleum products including natural gas liquids coming from various processing plants through a pipeline system. This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves incorporating several administrative revisions made through construction permit 887-M2, incorporate a recent minor operating permit modification (P202-R2M2), and update monitoring protocols to current Department standards.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 887-M2 (and its revisions), and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit – P202-R2M1. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NO_x) at 131.0 tpy (-1.5); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 161.6 tpy (-6.3); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 20.8 tpy (-0.6); Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 1.1 tpy (+0.1); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 2.2 tpy (-0.1); Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 2.2 tpy (-0.1); total suspended particulate matter (TSP) at 2.2 tpy (-0.1); and greenhouse gas (CO_{2e}) < 75,000 tpy. The facility is a minor source of greenhouse gas emissions.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance. The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 7, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77, and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, GG, JJJJ, and KKKK; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A and ZZZZ; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before November 5, 2016.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P202-R3 by contacting Jim Nellessen at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816. Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
