

PUBLIC NOTICE
For
Air Quality Operating Permit
for West Eunice Compressor Station of Regency Field Services LLC

Regency Field Services LLC at 600 N. Marienfeld Street, Suite 700; Midland, TX 79701 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its West Eunice Compressor Station. The exact location of the facility is at latitude 32 degrees, 25 minutes, 41.2123 seconds and longitude -103 degrees, 12 minutes, 40.1501 seconds. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 3 miles southwest of Eunice in Lea County, New Mexico. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P242-R2 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 755.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of the facility is to compress natural gas for pipeline transport. This operating permit application is for permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action incorporates NSR Significant Revision 2103-M6.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 2103-M6, and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit P242-R1M2. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NO_x) at 173.3 tons per year (tpy)(-17.8); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 120.8 tpy(+0.2); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 87.1 tpy(+7.0); Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 6.0 tpy(-0.1); Hydrogen Sulfide (H₂S) at 2.3 tpy(no change); Total Suspended Particulate Matter (TSP) at 4.2 tpy(-0.1), Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 4.2 tpy(-0.1), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 4.2 tpy(-0.1); Total Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs) at 15.2 tpy(+2.7); and greenhouse gas (CO₂e) <75,000 tpy. The facility is a minor, < 100,000 tpy CO₂e source of greenhouse gas emissions.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 1, 3, 7, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77, and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, JJJJ, and OOOO; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A and ZZZZ; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before August 31, 2017.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P242-R2 by contacting Linsey Hurst at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
