Air Quality Operating Permit
for Hart Canyon Compressor Station of Enterprise Field Services, LLC

Enterprise Field Services, LLC at PO Box 4324; Houston, TX 77210-4324 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Hart Canyon Compressor Station. The owner of this plant is Enterprise Field Services, LLC. The exact location of the facility is/will be at latitude 36 deg, 52 min, 53.95 sec and longitude -107 deg, 54 min, 6.24 sec. To aid in locating this facility, the facility is located approximately 6 miles NE of Aztec in San Juan County, New Mexico. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P002R3 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 1181.

Previously, the plant received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of the plant is to compress natural for transmission through a pipeline.

This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action will incorporate the changes for this facility permitted by NSR permit 0770M4. This includes correcting serial numbers, reassigning engine unit numbers, updating SO₂ emissions to reflect accurate gas sulfur content, and revising Start-up, shutdown, Maintenance, and Malfunction recordkeeping permit conditions.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 0770M4, and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit action P002R2; emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NO_x) at 116.0 tpy (no change); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 238.6 tpy (no change); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 43.7 tpy (+10.3); The facility is a CO₂ a minor, (<100,000 tpy) source of green house gas emissions.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance status.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this plant will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 3, 7, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A and ZZZZ; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality permit on or before May10, 2012.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P002R3. Contact the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, Operating Permit Unit, 1301 Siler Rd, Bldg B, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87507-3113.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
