Air Quality Operating Permit
for Northeastern New Mexico Regional Landfill of Northeast New Mexico Regional Landfill

Northeast New Mexico Regional Landfill at PO Box 129; Wagon Mound, NM 87752 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Northeastern New Mexico Regional Landfill. The owner of this plant is Northeast New Mexico Regional Landfill. The exact location of the facility is at latitude 36 deg, 6 min, 25 sec and longitude 104 deg, 40 min, 30 sec. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 5 miles N of Wagon Mound in Mora County, New Mexico. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P189LR2 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 930.

The facility was not required to obtain an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of the facility is to accept and dispose of solid waste. This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. There are no changes to the existing air emission limits in this permitting action.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 7, 61, 70, 71, 73, and 77; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A and WWW; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before August 28, 2013.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P189L by contacting Elizabeth Kuehn at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
