Air Quality Operating Permit
for Mountainair No7 Compressor Station of Transwestern Pipeline Company

Transwestern Pipeline Company (Air Quality) at 6381 North Main Street; Roswell, NM 88201 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Mountainair No7 Compressor Station. The owner of this plant is Transwestern Pipeline Company (Air Quality). The exact location of the facility is/will be at latitude 34 deg, 16 min, 42.7746 sec [deg., min., sec.] and longitude -106 deg, 6 min, 15 sec [deg., min., sec.]. This facility is located approximately 12 miles SSW of Mountainair in Torrance County, New Mexico. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P153R3 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 1569.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of the facility is to compress natural gas.

This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves adding a Mist Eliminator to the facility.

The estimated maximum air pollutant emissions to the atmosphere from this plant after the requested operating permit is granted are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit – P153-R2. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NO_x) at 2263.5 tpy (no change); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 247.6 tpy (no change); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 165.7tpy (+8); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 4.8 tpy (no change) , and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 4.8 toy (no change).

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 7, 61, 70, 71, 73, and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A and ZZZZ and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before March 12, 2015.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P153R3 by contacting Rhonda Trujillo at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
