# NAAQS for Criteria Pollutants

- Carbon Monoxide (CO)
- Nitrogen Dioxide (NO<sub>2</sub>)
- Sulfur Dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>)
- Particulate Matter (PM<sub>10</sub>)
- Lead (Pb)
- **Ozone (O<sub>3</sub>) (NO<sub>x</sub> + VOC)**
  - 1-hr average = .12 ppm
  - 8-hr average = .084 ppm
