**Administrative Completeness Determination for  
Proposed General Construction Permit No. GCP-4**

The New Mexico Environment Department proposes to issue General Construction Permit GCP-4, containing the following information and criteria. I affirm that the information and criteria that NMED proposes to include in GCP-4 are administratively complete:

The Scope of this GCP shall be limited to:

- The following Geographical areas of New Mexico: All areas except Bernalillo County and Tribal Lands.
- Registered Sources with Maximum emissions into the air of: 95 Tons per Year (TPY) of NOx, CO and VOC, 30 TPY of PM10, or SO2, 20 TPY of total Hazardous Air Pollutants, 8 TPY of any single HAP, and 0.5 TPY of H2S.
- The following types of facilities, equipment, and controls: Combustion sources that include the following emission units and no others: 1) engines and/or turbines that utilize low emission technology, 2) engines and/or turbines that are equipped with catalytic converters, 3) glycol dehydrators, 4) amine units, 5) flares, 6) thermal oxidizers, 7) reboilers, separators and heaters, 8) condensers, 9) storage tanks, 10) cryogenic units, and 11) truck loading operations.
- The following maximum operating schedules: 24 hours per day, 366 days/year.

This GCP shall:

- Cover sources that are generally homogeneous in terms of operations, processes and emissions, that are subject to the same or substantially similar requirements, and that are not subject to case-by-case standards or requirements.
- Specify the contents of a complete application required to register under the GCP.
- Include sufficient terms and conditions to assure that all sources registered under and operating in accordance with the general construction permit will meet all applicable requirements under the CAA, NM Air Quality Control Act and NMACs, including state and federal Ambient Air Quality Standards.
- Include monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements appropriate to the source and sufficient to ensure compliance with the GCP.
- Include terms and conditions to address and report emissions occurring during upsets, startups and maintenance.
- Specify that any document, including any application form, report, compliance certification and supporting data, submitted under the GCP shall (unless otherwise determined by the Department) be notarized and signed under oath or affirmation by the operator, the owner or an authorized representative, certifying, to the best of his or her knowledge, the truth of all information in the application and addenda, if any.
