

**NOTICE OF COMPLETENESS DETERMINATION
AND PUBLIC HEARING FOR AIR QUALITY PERMIT
NO. GCP-4,
GENERAL CONSTRUCTION PERMIT FOR
COMBUSTION SOURCES AND RELATED
EQUIPMENT**

COMPLETENESS DETERMINATION

The Air Quality Bureau of the New Mexico Environment Department (Department) has made a preliminary determination to issue General Air Quality Permit No. GCP-4. This general construction permit is issued under the New Mexico Air Quality Regulation 20.2.72 NMAC, Construction Permits, Section 220, General Permits. Facilities that qualify for this general permit may register with the Department and assure that they can meet the equipment and emission limitations. Registered facilities are minor sources under New Mexico Air Quality Regulation 20 NMAC 2.70, Operating Permits. Facilities may include the following emission units and no others: 1) engines and/or turbines that utilize low emission technology, 2) engines and/or turbines that are equipped with catalytic converters, 3) glycol dehydrators, 4) amine units, 5) flares, 6) thermal oxidizers, 7) reboilers, separators and heaters, 8) condensers, 9) storage tanks, 10) cryogenic units, 11) truck loading operations, and 12) ancillary equipment.

The Department limits the annual emissions in tons per year (TPY) from each registered Facilities to no more than:

- a. 95 TPY each of nitrogen oxides (NOx), carbon monoxide (CO), and volatile organic compounds (VOCs);
- b. 25 TPY of Particulate Matter (PM10);
- c. 30 TPY of Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂);
- d. 8 TPY of individual hazardous air pollutants (HAP); &
- e. 20 TPY of the sums of all HAPs.

The Department has modeled these maximum emissions from plants to determine that they meet the New Mexico Ambient Air Quality Standards, the National Ambient Air Quality Standards, and Prevention of Significant Deterioration increments.

AVAILABILITY OF INFORMATION

Any interested person may review a copy of the Completeness Determination at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 2048 Galisteo, Santa Fe, NM or at any of the Department District Offices. All interested persons have thirty (30) days, from the date this notice is published, to notify the Department in writing of their interest in the draft general permit. The Department will notify all such persons of when and where the draft Air Quality Permit No. GCP-4 may be reviewed. Any person who does not express interest in writing prior to the end of this first thirty (30) day period will not receive such notification. Interested persons may review the Draft Permit and the Department's Analysis for thirty (30) days after it becomes available. Written comments on the analysis or draft general permit may be submitted to the Department during this second thirty (30) day period.

Interested persons must submit their written comments to the New Mexico Environment Dept., Air Quality Bureau, 2048 Galisteo, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87505.

PUBLIC HEARING

The Department has scheduled a public hearing to discuss proposed Air Quality Permit No. GCP-4 on Wednesday, August 13, from 9:00 to 5:00 p.m. in room number 317 of the State Capitol Building on the corner of Don Gasper and Paseo de Peralta, Santa Fe, New Mexico.

Any person who wishes to be a party at the Air Quality Permit No. GCP-4 Hearing must file an Entry of Appearance or Statement of Intent to Present Technical Testimony (Statement of Intent) with the New Mexico Environment Department, Hearing Clerk's Office, 1190 St. Francis Drive, Santa Fe, NM 87501, Room S-2050, by July 30, 2003. A party filing an Entry of Appearance must serve it on all of the other parties of record. A list of parties of record can be obtained from the Hearing Clerk.

Any person who wishes to be a party and who intends to provide a technical written statement or oral testimony concerning this Air Quality Permit No. GCP-4 must file a Statement of Intent with the New Mexico Environment Department, Hearing Clerk's Office, 1190 St. Francis Drive, Santa Fe, NM, 87501, Room S-2050, by July 30, 2003. The Statement must identify the person who is filing it; state whether that person supports or opposes the Permit; identify each witness' name, address, affiliation, education, and work background; estimate the length of direct testimony for each witness; identify all exhibits and attach copies of those not already in the Administrative Record or filed with the Hearing Clerk; list all technical materials relied upon by each witness in making statements of technical fact or opinion in the direct testimony; and attach a summary of the witness' testimony, stating the witness' opinion(s), and explaining the basis for such opinion(s).

Failure to file an Entry of Appearance or a Statement of Intent by 5:00 p.m. on July 30, 2003 will prevent a person from being able to question other participants in the Hearing, but will not prevent a person from presenting a general written or oral statement at the Hearing. Any person may provide a general written or oral statement at the Hearing without providing any previous notice to the Department.

The Hearing will proceed according to 20.1.4 NMAC, Permit Procedures.
