DRINKING WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND

What?

- Low-cost financing for drinking water facilities
- Projects protecting drinking water quality, water sources, treatment, transmission, distribution lines, storage
- Can fund planning, design, land acquisition, and associated pre-project costs
- Infrastructure to interconnect or regionalize water systems

Details?

- Project type determines funding
- 0% to 0.01% interest for public entities
- Principal forgiveness up to 90%

How to Apply?

- Open year-round
- Projects reviewed quarterly
- Preapplication form at this QR code



RURAL INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM

What is it?

- Grants and/or loans for water, wastewater, and solid waste projects in rural communities
- Funds available within 8 weeks

Flexible funds for phasing projects

- Up to \$2 million annually per entity
 - \$1.5 million annually in loans at 1% or less
 - \$500,000 annually in grants

Is it eligible?

- Mutual domestic associations
- Public entities serving municipalities under 20,000 residents or counties below 200,000

CLEAN WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND

What is it?

- Ultra-low interest loans for planning, design, and construction
- Available for wastewater, stormwater, and other projects protecting surface water or groundwater
- Applications accepted year-round!

Details?

- 0% to 0.01% for public entities
- 2.375% for private entities
- Loan subsidies available

How Much?

- \$1 Billion in funding available over the next 3 years
- No upper funding limit for projects

PUBLIC HEALTH IS AT RISK: NEW MEXICO MUST INVEST IN WATER INFRASTRUCTURE

On July 30, 2024, NMED sent letters to 138 out-of-compliance drinking water system serving 160,000 customers across New Mexico—that were below the required safe drinking water standard. High levels of arsenic, uranium, and fluoride were detected.
