**NOTE CHANGES FOR SFY 2014 BELOW**

Dear Interested Party,

The New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) is soliciting applications for eligible projects under the Clean Water State Revolving Loan Fund (CWSRF) for placement on the State Fiscal Year 2014 (SFY 2014) CWSRF Integrated Projects Priority List (IPPL). The CWSRF is a federal program administered by NMED that provides low-cost, subsidized loans to public entities for the planning, design, and construction of wastewater collection and treatment facilities, storm water drainage projects, and non-point source water pollution control projects that protect surface and ground water.

**All applications must be submitted by close of business Wednesday, May 8, 2013** to NMED's Construction Programs Bureau (CPB). Applications are encouraged from all Municipalities, Counties, Water and Sanitation Districts, Indian Tribes and interested parties. CWSRF loans are offered at below market rates, currently ranging from 0% to 3% depending on census & economic criteria. Partial loan subsidies in the form of grants may also be available. An application to the CWSRF program does not obligate a community to proceed with the proposed project but a project must be on the IPPL to be eligible for CWSRF funding.

**There will be no carry-over of applications from previous years. All applicants must submit a new Priority List Attachment Form** (available in Excel and PDF at <http://www.nmenv.state.nm.us/cpb/CWSRFPage.htm>) **and a new Project Interest Form** (online at <http://swim.nmenv.state.nm.us/SWIM/index.php>) **to be considered for the SFY 2014 IPPL.** The Priority List Attachment Form has been updated to reflect the new prioritization system that the New Mexico Water Quality Control Commission adopted on April 9, 2013.

Changes at the federal level over the last four years prompted the need to update NMED's prioritization criteria. The new prioritization system takes into account five general factors: Water Quality Improvement, Environmental Compliance, Financial Affordability, Sustainability, and Readiness to Proceed, as well as one bonus category, Green Project Reserve. The revised system was produced using a collaborative approach with NMED's Surface Water Quality Bureau and Groundwater Quality Bureau. ## **GREEN PROJECTS**

Communities are strongly encouraged to apply for financing of water quality protection projects such as watershed management and water reuse projects that address at least one of the following four federally-mandated "green" requirements:

- Green Infrastructure – Green stormwater infrastructure includes a wide variety of practices at multiple scales that manage wet weather and maintain and/or restore natural hydrology by infiltrating, evapotranspiring, harvesting and using stormwater.
- Water Efficiency Improvements – Water efficiency improvement is defined as the use of improved technologies and practices to deliver equal or better services with less water. Water efficiency encompasses conservation and reuse efforts, as well as water loss reduction and prevention, to protect water resources for the future.
- Energy Efficiency Improvements – Energy efficiency is the use of improved technologies and practices to reduce the energy consumption of water quality projects, use energy in a more efficient way, and/or produce/utilize renewable energy.
- Environmentally Innovative Activities – Environmentally innovative projects include those that demonstrate new and/or innovative approaches to delivering services or managing water resources in a more sustainable way.

Planning, design, and/or building activities may be approved as green. Entire projects, or the appropriate discrete components of projects, may be eligible as green. Projects do not have to be part of a larger capital project to be eligible. All projects or project components must clearly advance one or more of the objectives articulated in the four categories discussed above. The application process has 2 steps:

To be considered for funding beginning July 1, 2013, you must submit a new online Project Interest Form (PIF) **AND** a new Priority List Attachment Form (PLAF) for each project. **Both must be completed and received no later than Wednesday, May 8, 2013 at 5:00 P.M. Mountain Daylight Time.**

The CWSRF Intended Use Plan and the proposed SFY 2014 Integrated Projects Priority List will be available for public review and comment on the website listed above from June 10, 2013 to June 28, 2013.
