**Public Involvement Meeting in Santa Fe on
New Mexico's Implementation of EPA's Clean Power Plan**

Santa Fe – On Wednesday, Nov.18 the New Mexico Environment Department will host the first of several public involvement meetings to briefly present the requirements of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) recently enacted Clean Power Plan (CPP) in order to engage with New Mexicans regarding the Plan's requirements, and to draw upon that input as the state's options for CPP implementation continue to be developed. EPA's Clean Power Plan sets requirements for states to lower carbon dioxide emissions, especially from existing fossil fuel-fired power plants. The State of New Mexico will develop a State Implementation Plan to ensure that these federal requirements are met.

The meeting begins Wednesday, Nov. 18 at 4 p.m. at the Southside Library in Santa Fe with a brief introduction to the Clean Power Plan, followed by the opportunity for interested citizens to share their comments and questions.
