PRODUCTS: Townsend Farms Organic Antioxidant Blend frozen berries, 3 lb. bag,
UPC 0 78414 404448 (see package photos below).

Recalled codes are located on the back of the package with the words
“BEST BY” followed by the code T012415 sequentially through
T053115, followed by a letter. No other Townsend products, frozen or
fresh, are affected by this recall.

MANUFACTURER: Townsend Farms, Fairview, OR

RECALLED BY: Townsend Farms

DISTRIBUTION: Nationwide at Costo Stores, including three stores in the greater
Albuquerque area.

QUANTITY: Unknown

REASON: Product has the potential to be contaminated with hepatitis A virus, and is linked to an illness outbreak in the United States, including several cases in New Mexico.

ADDITIONAL INFO: Costco stores have removed the product from their shelves and initiated telephone callbacks to customers known to have purchased the product, although the completeness of the callback program is unknown.

Costco stores are only in the greater Albuquerque area within New Mexico. Customers may have traveled from outlying areas and purchased the product for later consumption and still have the product in their freezers.


Persons who have consumed the product in the last 14 days should consider contacting their health care provider about getting a vaccination against hepatitis A.

REQUIRED ACTION: **Ensure product has been removed from shelves at Costco stores. Notify potential customers in communities that might shop at Albuquerque Costco stores and purchased this product to not consume it, but instead dispose of it immediately.**


