SECTION II: BUSINESS FEE DEFINITIONS

- 1 “Episodic generator” means a generator that has a planned or unplanned event that does not normally occur during generator operations, resulting in an increase in the generation of hazardous waste that exceeds the calendar month quantity limits for the generator’s usual category;
- 2 “Emergency Environmental Protection Agency (“EPA”) identification number” means a generator that meets the definition of a large quantity or small quantity generator due to an emergency and requires an EPA identification number to dispose of the hazardous waste;
- 3 Compliance assistance visit for salvage yards” means a pre-arranged inspection at a salvage yard in order for the salvage yard to acquire a New Mexico Motor Vehicle Division Auto Recycler’s license;
- 4 40 262 Subpart K activies refer to "Alternative Requirements for Hazardous Waste Determination and Accumulation of Unwanted Material for Laboratories Owned by Eligible Entities
- 5 40 260.10 Hazardous secondary material generator means any person whose act or process produces hazardous secondary materials at the generating facility. For purposes of this paragraph, “generating facility” means all contiguous property owned, leased, or otherwise controlled by the hazardous secondary material generator. For the purposes of § 261.2(a)(2)(ii) and § 261.4(a)(23), a facility that collects hazardous secondary materials from other persons is not the hazardous secondary material generator.
