I. Public Involvement Plan Overview

The New Mexico Environment Department (NMED), Hazardous Waste Bureau (Bureau or HWB) developed this Public Involvement Plan (PIP) for a permit modification request by the U.S. Army White Sands Missile Range (WSMR) for a Class 3 permit modification to change the status of two solid waste management units from corrective action required to corrective action complete under the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) and the New Mexico Hazardous Waste Act (HWA).

WSMR is located in the Tularosa Basin of south-central, New Mexico. Portions of WSMR extend west into the Jornada del Muerto Basin. The headquarters (Main Post) area of WSMR is located at the southwestern corner of the installation, approximately 27 miles east-northeast of Las Cruces, New Mexico, and 45 miles north of El Paso, Texas. WSMR is the largest land area military installation in the United States, encompassing approximately 3,200 square miles of land in Doña Ana, Socorro, Lincoln, Otero, and Sierra Counties in south-central New Mexico. Two sites located at the Main Post are being recommended for corrective action complete. The purpose of this PIP is to plan for providing public participation opportunities and information regarding the requested permit modification as required by statute or regulation, and also as the Bureau determines is needed to facilitate participation by the affected community.

This PIP integrates information about the community and identifies resources needed by the Bureau to successfully incorporate community participation activities into the RCRA decision-making process. The PIP identifies the NMED staff and resources needed to accomplish these activities.

Both the RCRA regulations at 40 CFR 270.42 and the New Mexico Hazardous Waste Management Regulations (HWMR) at 20.4.1.900 and 901 NMAC require public participation as part of the process for a Class 3 permit modification. The Bureau will meet the public participation requirements for the permit modification process at WSMR by adhering to this PIP, which includes all the applicable policy, regulatory and statutory public participation requirements.

In developing this PIP, community participation needs at the site were assessed to ensure appropriate promotion of public outreach by identifying whether there is a combination of environmental and demographic factors (e.g., low income, minority, limited English proficiency, linguistically isolated households) that may affect public participation actions. This assessment identifies community outreach needs based on the type of activity and potential effects to the surrounding community, and addresses the provision of public access to information about the cleanup process.

To the extent possible, public participation and informational activities related to implementation of this PIP will be held within the timelines outlined below. Public notice activities are subject to statutory or regulatory deadlines.

Draft documents issued for public comment will generally be made available for a 60-day period to allow for formal public review and comments and there will be a minimum 30-day notice for public informational meetings, if scheduled. Based on the demographics of the area, the Bureau

will provide pertinent information in both English and Spanish in public notices, public informational meeting notices, and other announcements (e.g., radio broadcasts, newspaper notices, mailings.).

If public informational meetings are held, the Bureau will make arrangements for simultaneous Spanish interpretation during the informational meetings, and, to the extent practicable, make arrangements for translating to languages other than Spanish, if applicable, and also for obtaining services for persons with disabilities.

This PIP was developed by the Hazardous Waste Bureau and may be amended to address specific actions at WSMR and after considering public comments and feedback. The Bureau will make the final approval of the PIP and amendments.

Hazardous Waste Bureau actions issued for public comment will include specific instructions for submitting comments related to the permit action.

III. Assistance for Non-English Language Speakers and Persons with Disabilities

The Bureau will include information about how persons may request non-English speaker language assistance and accommodations for persons with disabilities (e.g., deaf and/or non-English language interpreters) in public notices and notices for informational meetings or hearings, if held, related to the permit modification request. Public notices will direct public requests for assistance to the Bureau contact, who will notify the Department's Non-Discrimination Coordinator. V. Regulatory Background for Public Participation

The Resource Conservation and Recovery Act regulations at 40 CFR 270.42 require the public to be notified regarding permit applications, permit modifications and the issuance of draft permits. Both the applicant and the regulatory agency have public notification responsibilities based on the type of proposed action. The Bureau is required to issue public notices for Class 3 permit modifications and the issuance of draft permits in accordance with 40 CFR 270 and the New Mexico Hazardous Waste Management Regulations in accordance with 20.4.1.900, 901 and 1102 NMAC. The HWMR require that public notice of issuance of a draft permit or a notice of intent to deny, and of any public hearing scheduled, "shall be given by publication of a notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the area affected, broadcasts over local radio stations and by mailing a copy of the notice to the permit applicant, those individuals on the department mailing list of persons interested in hazardous waste permit actions, and to any unit of local, state and federal government as may be applicable" as specified by 20.4.1.901.C(3). The Bureau public notice activities for this action are described in Section X below.

VI. EJSCREEN Summary

To assess the need to specifically reach and inform Limited English Proficient (LEP) community populations to encourage public participation, two search criteria were utilized (EJSCREEN and American Fact Finder). The first tool, Environmental Justice mapping and screening (EJSCREEN), was developed by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). EJSCREEN provides up to 11 environmental indexes and six demographic indexes. Through EJSCREEN, demographic data is available for 2011-2015 via the American Community Survey (ACS), the 2010 U.S. Census, and the 2000 U.S. Census.

To meet the search criteria specified in NMED policy 07-13, preliminary screenings were conducted using EPAs EJSCREEN tool to generate reports from the American Community Survey (ACS) using a four-mile and also an eight- mile radius from the Facility. This report, which is included as Appendix A to this PIP, indicated that there are 435 households within a four-mile radius (684 households within eight-miles) from the facility (considered the affected community) and the per capita income households for the population within a four-mile radius was \$20,674 (22,348 within eight-miles).

The percent of minority population within a four-mile radius of the Facility was 40% (49% within eight-miles) and the percent of population by race within a four-mile radius was 60% white Non-Hispanic (51% within eight-miles). Within a four-mile radius, 71% of the population is listed as white Hispanic, (72% within eight-miles), 22% were listed as black (17% within eight-miles), 0% American Indian (0% within eight-miles), 2% were listed as Asian (2% within eight-miles), and 1% were listed as Other (6% within eight-miles). The percentage of linguistically isolated households within a four-mile radius from the Facility was 0% (100% within eight miles). The portion of linguistically isolated households who spoke Spanish was

0% within four-miles of the Facility (approximately 1% within eight-miles). No households were listed as speaking other Indo-European languages for both the four- and eight-mile radius from the Facility. The percentage of the population who were age 5+ who spoke only English was 97% and 100% spoke English very well within a four-mile radius of the Facility (81% spoke only English and only 5% spoke English less than very well within an eight-mile radius). These results indicate that for the affected community, the percentage of persons who speak English less than very well for both the four- and eight-mile radius are considerably less than the state average (10%) or national average (8.7%) based on 2010 U.S. census data.

The second tool, American Fact Finder, was developed by the United States Census Bureau. The tool presents language data from the ACS for languages spoken at home. This tool was chosen to supplement search criteria to be thorough in our efforts to reach LEP communities. While there were differences in the data when compared to EJSCREEN, the percentages related to limited English proficiency and demographic distribution generally corroborated the EJSCREEN data.

Based on the EJSCREEN and American Fact Finder results, along with the history of public involvement at the site and the site background, the Bureau has determined that public notice documents should provide basic information concerning public involvement opportunities in both English and Spanish. This information will include how to request materials in Spanish or to speak with Hazardous Waste Bureau staff through an interpreter.

VII. Public Participation Activities

The Bureau will conduct the following public participation and outreach activities associated with this permit modification process:

- Postal mailings
- Radio announcements
- Newspaper publications

VIII. Postal Mailing or E-Mailing of Notices to Persons on the Facility-Specific Mailing List

The Hazardous Waste Bureau maintains a facility mailing list for WSMR that includes individuals and local, state and federal government and tribal agencies interested in RCRA-related facility activities. The Bureau maintains contact information which is updated or supplemented, if additional information becomes available. Individuals, organizations, and other interested parties are added to the list as requested. If the Bureau receives returned mail subsequent to issuance of a public notice indicating the recipient is no longer at the listed address, the name may be removed from a facility mailing list.

IX. Notices in the State Newspaper and Local Newspapers

Public notices that are required to be published in state and local newspapers will be published in English and Spanish in the Albuquerque Journal (state wide circulation) and the Las Cruces Sun News. There is no local Spanish Language newspaper in Southern New Mexico.

X.Public Notices

Public notices are issued for public comment periods related to the issuance of 1) draft permits, including major permit modifications, 2) public informational meetings, and 3) selected other public notifications. Public notices are mailed to persons included on the facility mailing list, published in the Albuquerque Journal and the Las Cruces Sun News, broadcast as public service announcements on radio, and posted on the Hazardous Waste Bureau website. The notifications will be issued in Spanish and English. These notices will provide general information about the draft permit or permit modification, contact information for submitting comments or requesting a public hearing, and, if held, the time and location of public informational meetings.

XI. Factsheets

The Hazardous Waste Bureau will develop a fact sheet to accompany the Class 3 permit modification, as required by 20.4.1.901.A(2). Fact sheets provide information regarding public participation, a description of the facility, a description of the proposed permit action and next steps in the process. Copies of a fact sheet will be sent to any person upon request in accordance with 20.4.1.901.A(2). Fact sheets also will be made available for viewing at the Hazardous Waste Bureau and on the Bureau website and at other locations as specified in Section XV below.

XII. Public Comment Periods

The Hazardous Waste Bureau is required to provide a minimum of 45 days for public review and comment on a draft Class 3 permit modification in accordance with 20.4.1.901.A(3). The Bureau generally provides a 60-day comment period for major permit actions to allow the public an opportunity to comment on Class 3 permit modifications. The Hazardous Waste Bureau may extend the public comment period, if a request is received during the public comment period to extend the comment period based on significant interest. The Hazardous Waste Bureau will provide public notice of any extension to a public comment period as described in Section X above.

XIII. Public Information Meetings

The Facility is located in the Tularosa Basin of south-central New Mexico and the main post is 27 miles from the closest city with any significant population (Las Cruces). Both Solid Waste Managing Units (SWMU) were determined to not manage hazardous waste within their units, their incinerators have either been removed or decommissioned and are no longer operational, and each unit was determined not to pose an unacceptable risk to human health or the environment.

Because the contact with the public, and therefore members of the public with limited English proficiency, is infrequent and the site does not pose a risk to human health or the environment, the Bureau does not plan to hold a public informational meeting to provide information regarding this Permit modification, and will publish the public notice for this action in accordance with 20.4.1.900 and 901 NMAC and as described in Section X above.

XIV. Other Outreach

In addition to the public notice procedures described in Section X above, notices in the form of flyers announcing public comment periods and informational meetings, if held, may be posted in locations throughout the community (e.g., local businesses, schools, libraries). All notices will be posted on the NMED Hazardous Waste Bureau website. Depending on the cost and a radio station's public service broadcast availability, the Bureau may use commercial radio announcements or informational broadcasts in both Spanish and English.

Because the contact with the public, and therefore members of the public with limited English proficiency, is infrequent and the sites do not pose a risk to human health or the environment, the Bureau does not plan to provide additional public outreach for this permit action.

XVI. Responses to Comments

The Hazardous Waste Bureau must ensure that the approved final permits are consistent with the New Mexico Hazardous Waste Management Regulations and the Hazardous Waste Act. All written comments submitted on the draft Class 3 permit modification will become part of the administrative record, will be considered in formulating a final decision, and may cause the draft permit modification to be modified. The Hazardous Waste Bureau will respond in writing to all significant public comment. The response will specify which provisions, if any, of the draft permit modification have been changed in the final permit decision, and the reasons for the change. This response will also be posted on the Bureau's website and the Bureau will notify all persons who have provided written comments.

After consideration of all written public comments received, the Bureau will issue, or modify and issue, the permit modification. If the Bureau modifies and issues the permit modification, the Permittee shall be provided by mail a copy of the modified permit modification and a detailed written statement of reasons for the modifications. The NMED Secretary will make the final permit modification decision publicly available. The Secretary's decision shall constitute a final agency decision and may be appealed as provided by the Hazardous Waste Act. All persons that provided written comments, or who requested notification in writing, will be notified of the final decision by mail.

Households not paying cash rent are excluded from the calculation of median gross rent.

Telephone service data are not available for certain geographic areas due to problems with data collection of this question that occurred in 2015 and 2016. Both ACS 1-year and ACS 5-year files were affected. It may take several years in the ACS 5-year files until the estimates are available for the geographic areas affected.

While the 2012-2016 American Community Survey (ACS) data generally reflect the February 2013 Office of Management and Budget (OMB) definitions of metropolitan and micropolitan statistical areas; in certain instances the names, codes, and boundaries of the principal cities shown in ACS tables may differ from the OMB definitions due to differences in the effective dates of the geographic entities.

Estimates of urban and rural population, housing units, and characteristics reflect boundaries of urban areas defined based on Census

2010 data. As a result, data for urban and rural areas from the ACS do not necessarily reflect the results of ongoing urbanization.

 - 6. An '***** entry in the margin of error column indicates that the estimate is controlled. A statistical test for sampling variability is not appropriate.
