Air Quality Operating Permit for San Luis Pump Station of Mid-America Pipeline Company, LLC

Mid-America Pipeline Company, LLC at PO Box 4324, Houston, TX 77210-4324 has submitted a permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its San Luis Pump Station. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 35.705017, -107.106517 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 25 miles S of Cuba in Sandoval County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P202-R4 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 1109.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of the facility is to assist with the transport of natural gas liquids (NGL) and petroleum refined products from various processing plants through a pipeline system to consumers. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action is a TV renewal and no changes other than insignificant activity (addition of a fuel storage tank for the emergency generator) are being proposed.

The estimated maximum air pollutant emissions to the atmosphere from this facility after the requested operating permit is issued, are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from the NSR permit 0087-M2. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 131.0 tpy (-37.2); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 161.6 tpy (+28.3); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 20.8 tpy (-1.2); Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 1.1 tpy; Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 2.2 tpy; Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 2.2 tpy; and greenhouse gas (CO₂e) <75,000 tpy.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 7, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77 and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, GG, JJJJ and KKKK; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A and ZZZZ; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before June 18, 2022.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P202-R4 by contacting Vanessa Springer at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816, or by email at Vanessa.Springer@state.nm.us.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.

Due to the public health emergency order, certain NMED offices are closed to the public.
