Legal Notice For <u>Air Quality Operating Permit</u> for Frontier - Maljamar Gas Plant of Frontier Field Services LLC C/O Durango Midstream LLC

Frontier Field Services LLC C/O Durango Midstream LLC at 10077 Grogans Mill Road Suite 300; The Woodlands, TX 77380 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Frontier - Maljamar Gas Plant. The owner of this plant is Frontier Field Services LLC C/O Durango Midstream LLC. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 32.814444, -103.771389 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 2.8 mi SW of Maljamar in Lea County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P123R3M1 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 565.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation.

The main purpose of the facility is to recover natural gas liquids (NGL) and residue gas for sale by removing sweet gas using amine units. The NGL is then dehydrated, compressed and separated into heavy and light hydrocarbons. The heavy carbons are collected in pressure tanks and loaded into tankers. The vapors are sent to the natural gas pipeline.

This operating permit application is for a permit modification. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves incorporation of NSR permit 319-M12. This permit incorporates addition of one new natural gas fired 4SLB engine (Unit 44), one new amine contactor, modification of fugitive emissions, and removal of one flare (Unit 43). The description of this modification is for informational purposes only and is not enforceable.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 319-M12 and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit – P123-R1. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 179.1 tpy (+4.3); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 153.8 tpy (+3.3); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 146.4 tpy (+1.5); Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 249.8 tpy (+0.5); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM_{10}) at 6.7 tpy (+0.4), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less ($PM_{2.5}$) at 6.7 tpy (+0.4); and greenhouse gas (CO_2 e) 142,398 tpy.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 7, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77, and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, Dc, KKK, JJJJ, OOOO and OOOOa; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A and ZZZZ; 40 CFR 64; 40 CFR 68 and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before May 31, 2022.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
