Air Quality Operating Permit
for Compressor Station No 167 of Natural Gas Pipeline Co of America

Natural Gas Pipeline Co of America at 2 North Nevada, Colorado Springs, CO 80903 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Compressor Station No 167. The owner of this plant is Natural Gas Pipeline Co of America. The exact location of the facility is/will be at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 32.914108, -103.631817 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 8.9 mi NE of Maljamar, in Lea County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P141R4M1 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 667.

The facility was not required to obtain an air quality construction permit and is in operation.

The main purpose of the facility is to is to compress natural gas for transportation to pipeline.

This operating permit application is for a permit modification. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action incorporates the reference to 40 CFR 60 Subparts A and JJJ standards, applicable to the replacement unit 02-AUX. The 22.5 hp Kohler emergency generator is being replaced with a 30 hp Cummins emergency generator.

The estimated maximum air pollutant emissions to the atmosphere, from this facility after the requested operating permit is issued, are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit – P141R4. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NO_x) at 466.4 tpy (+0.1); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 47.7 tpy (+2.6); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 11.5 tpy (no change); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 8.9 tpy (no change), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 8.9 tpy (no change); and greenhouse gas (CO₂e) < 75,000 tpy. The facility is a minor source of greenhouse gas emissions.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 1, 7, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 71 and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A and JJJ; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A and ZZZ; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before July 11, 2022.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P141R4M1 by contacting Julia Kuhn at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816, or by email at julia.kuhn@state.nm.us.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and

the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.

Due to the public health emergency order, certain NMED offices are closed to the public. The permit application is currently available for review on the AQB Public Notices of Permitting Actions website www.env.nm.gov/public-notices.
