Air Quality Operating Permit
for Kutz Canyon Processing Plant of Harvest Four Corners LLC

Harvest Four Corners LLC at 1755 Arroyo Dr; Bloomfield, NM 87413 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Kutz Canyon Processing Plant. The owner of this plant is Harvest Four Corners LLC. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 36.669667, -107.961639 Datum: NAD83. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 190 County Road 4980 in San Juan County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P097-R4 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 1158.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The Kutz Canyon Processing Plant is a natural gas processing facility designed to remove ethane and heavier hydrocarbons from natural gas. The Kutz I Plant removes the heavier hydrocarbons using a refrigerated lean oil absorption process. The Kutz II Plant removes the heavier hydrocarbons using a cryogenic process.

This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves the five-year renewal and incorporates NSR 0301M11 modification.

Nitrogen Oxides (NO_x) at 1157.4 tons per year (tpy) (No Change); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 908.5 tpy (NC); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 889.9 tpy (+4.4); Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 1.7 tpy (NC); Particulate Matter (PM) at 17.9 tpy (NC), Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 17.5 tpy (NC), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 16.9 tpy (NC); and greenhouse gas (CO_{2e}) > 75,000 tpy.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 7, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, and 75 and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act; 40 CFR 60, Subparts A, GG and KKK; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A, HH and ZZZZ, DDDDD; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before December 29, 2022.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P097-R4 by contacting Joseph Kimbrell at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816, or by email at joseph.kimbrell@state.nm.us. Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.

Due to the public health emergency order, certain NMED offices are closed to the public. The permit application is currently available for review on the AQB Public Notices of Permitting Actions website www.env.nm.gov/public-notices.
