Air Quality Operating Permit
for Artesia Gas Plant of DCP Operating Company LP

DCP Operating Company, LP at 2107 CityWest Blvd Suite 600; Houston, TX 77042 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Artesia Gas Plant. The owner of this plant is DCP Operating Company LP. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 32.754972, -104.210028 Datum: NAD83. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 13 mi ESE of Artesia in Eddy County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P095-R4 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 199.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation.

The main purpose of the facility is to process natural gas, including condensate removal, H₂S and CO₂ removal with an amine unit, separation of natural gas liquids through the cryogenic plant, and inlet and residue compression.

This operating permit application is for a Title V permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves renewal of the existing Title V permit with incorporation of changes made by NSR permit 434-M10R8 issued December 7, 2021. The NSR permit 0434M10R8 implements revised monitoring, recordkeeping, and reporting requirements for the flares according to the Settlement Agreement and Stipulated Final Compliance Order (SASFCO) No. AQB 20-46 (CO) issued on September 10, 2021. There were no changes to emission limits from permit 434-M10R8.

There are no changes to the existing air emission limits in this permitting action.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 7, 38, 50, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 77, and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, Kb, KKK and JJJJ; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A, HH, ZZZZ and CCCCCC; 40 CFR 64; 40 CFR 68; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before February 22, 2022.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable-R4 state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.

Due to the public health emergency order, certain NMED offices are closed to the public.
