Air Quality Operating Permit for Camino Real Landfill of Camino Real Environmental Center

Camino Real Environmental Center at PO Box 580; Sunland Park, NM 88063 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Camino Real Landfill. The owner of this plant is Camino Real Environmental Center. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 31.795447, -106.592022 Datum: NAD83. This facility is located at 1000 Camino Real Blvd, Sunland Park, New Mexico, in Dona Ana County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P186LR4 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 167.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation.

The function of the facility is to dispose of municipal solid waste. The Camino Real Landfill is authorized to dispose of municipal solid waste and specific special wastes. Special wastes approved for disposal include petroleum contaminated soils (PCS), sludges, and industrial solid waste.

This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action incorporates the most recent NSR permit 7592M1 issued on December 21, 2021, consisting of five portable engines addition to the facility, to support daily operations. In addition, the application was revised to clarify and incorporate the transition of landfill regulations from 40 CFR 60, Subpart WWW, to 40 CFR 60, Subpart Cf/40 CFR 63, Subpart AAAA.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 7592M1 and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit – P186LR3M1. The emissions for the facility are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 39.1 tons per year (tpy) (+12.0); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 135.5 tpy (+11.8); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 58.1 tpy (+11.9); Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 9.1 tpy (+2.9); Particulate Matter (PM) at 86.4 tpy (+1.0); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM10) at 25.1 tpy (+1.0); and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM2.5) at 3.9 tpy (+1.0); and greenhouse gas (CO_2e) > 75,000 tpy.

There are no changes to the existing air emission limits in this permitting action.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 1, 7, 61, 64, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77, and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A and Cf; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A and AAAA; 40 CFR 68; 40 CFR 82; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before August 17, 2023.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
