## Legal Notice For <u>Air Quality Operating Permit</u> for Spartan Compressor Station of XTO Energy Inc

XTO Energy Inc at 22777 Springwoods Village Parkway; Spring, TX 77389 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Spartan Compressor Station. The owner of this plant is XTO Energy Inc. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 32.203334, -103.838056 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 13.5 mi E of Malaga in Eddy County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P293 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 38274.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation.

The main purpose of the facility is to separate oil, natural gas, and water from a nearby pipeline; temporarily store condensate onsite until it is removed via truck or pipeline; and compress dehydrated natural gas for transport through the sales line.

This operating permit application is for a new permit. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves incorporating the NSR Permit 7681M2 and adding conditions to demonstrate compliance with Title V.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 7681M2 and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 214 tpy; Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 242 tpy; Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 270 tpy; Sulfur Dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>) at 22 tpy; Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM<sub>10</sub>) at 17 tpy, and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM<sub>2.5</sub>) at 17 tpy; and greenhouse gas (CO<sub>2</sub>e) 263,110 tpy.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 1, 3, 7, 38, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 75, 77 and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, OOOOa, JJJJ (TBD); 40 CFR 63 Subparts HH, ZZZZ (TBD); and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before April 27, 2023.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P293 by contacting Joseph Kimbrell at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816, or by email at joseph.kimbrell@env.nm.gov.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.

Due to the public health emergency order, certain NMED offices are closed to the public.
