Legal Notice For <u>Air Quality Operating Permit</u> for Frac Cat Compressor Station of Targa Northern Delaware LLC

The owner of this plant is Targa Northern Delaware, LLC at PO Box 158; Artesia, NM 88211-0158. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 32.200583, -103.683756 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 24.3 mi SE of Loving in Lea County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P288M2 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 29403.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation.

The main purpose of the facility is to dehydrate and compress natural gas for transport.

Pursuant to 20.2.70.405.A(4) NMAC, the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) reopened the initial TV Operating Permit P288 for Frac Cat Compressor Station issued April 16, 2022, as the result of an EPA Order regarding Petition Numbers VI-2022-5. The Administrator has determined that the permit must be reissued to assure compliance with certain applicable requirements discussed in the Order.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 4221M6 and brought forward into permit P288 are as follows. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 118.9 tpy; Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 114.3 tpy; Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 72.3 tpy; Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 15.3 tpy; Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM_{10}) at 8.1 tpy; and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less ($PM_{2.5}$) at 8.1 tpy; and greenhouse gas (CO_2e) >75,000 tpy.

There are no changes to the existing air emission limits in this permitting action.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Parts Chapter 2, Parts 1, 7, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77 and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, Dc, JJJJ, OOOO, and OOOOa; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A, HH, ZZZZ, and DDDDD; 40 CFR 64 and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit after a 30-day public comment period followed by a 45-day EPA review period.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
