## <u>Air Quality Operating Permit</u> for Harvest - 32-7 CDP Compressor Station of Harvest Four Corners LLC

Harvest Four Corners LLC at 1755 Arroyo Dr; Bloomfield, NM 87413 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Harvest - 32-7 CDP Compressor Station. The owner of this plant is Harvest Four Corners LLC. The exact location of the facility is/will be at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 36.931389, -107.560278 Datum: NAD83. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 9 mi NNE of Navajo Dam in San Juan County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P195-R4 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 1221.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation.

The main purpose of the facility is to compress natural gas using compressor engines and dehydrate the gas using TEG dehydration unit before transporting it downstream through pipelines.

This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, there are no changes since TV significant modification P195-R3M2 other than incorporation of NSR Administrative revisions 1032-M9R2 through M9R9.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 1032-M9 through M9R9 and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit – P195-R4. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 201.5 tpy (no change); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 246 tpy (no change); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 215 tpy (-17.9); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM $_{10}$ ) at 7.7 tpy (no change), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM $_{2.5}$ ) at 7.7 tpy (no change); and greenhouse gas (CO $_{2}$ e) 203,374 tpy.

There are no changes to the existing air emission limits in this permitting action.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 7, 50, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77 and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts [A, JJJJ and OOOOa]; 40 CFR 63 Subparts [A, HH and ZZZZ]; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before September 24, 2023.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and

the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
