Air Quality Operating Permit  
for Val Verde Gas Treatment Plant of Harvest Four Corners LLC

Harvest Four Corners LLC at 1755 Arroyo Dr; Bloomfield, NM 87413 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Val Verde Gas Treatment Plant. The owner of this plant is Harvest Four Corners LLC. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 36.729722, -107.956111 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 2 miles NE of Bloomfield in San Juan County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P118-R4 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 1182.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of the facility is to function as a gas treatment plant. The major processes associated with the facility are removing carbon dioxide and water from coal seam gas collected from the surrounding area.

This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves incorporating revisions made in the last construction permit revisions (728-M11R1 and 728M11R2, administrative changes).

The estimated maximum air pollutant emissions to the atmosphere, from this facility after the requested operating permit is issued, are as follows: 223.4 tpy NO<sub>x</sub>, 174.4 tpy CO, 243.4 tpy VOC, 46.4 tpy SO<sub>2</sub>, 24.7 tpy PM<sub>10</sub>, 24.7 tpy PM<sub>2.5</sub>, and >100,000 tpy CO<sub>2e</sub> (greenhouse gas emissions). There are no changes to the existing air emission limits in this permitting action.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 50, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77 and 82; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, Dc, LLL; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A, HH, DDDDD; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before April 24, 2024.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
