Air Quality Operating Permit
for Aztec Central Delivery Point of Harvest Four Corners LLC

Harvest Four Corners LLC at 1755 Arroyo Drive; Bloomfield, NM 87413 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Aztec Central Delivery Point. The owner of this plant is Harvest Four Corners LLC. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 36.993611, -107.913056 Datum: NAD83. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 9.8 mi NNE of Aztec in San Juan County, NM. This application file has been assigned Operating Permit Number P164-R5 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 1276.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation.

The main purpose of the facility is to compress and dehydrate natural gas for pipeline transmission.

This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves incorporation of previously issued NSR administrative permits revisions 1327-M6R2 through M6R7.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 1327-M6 and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit – P164-R4. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NO_x) at 90.6 tpy (-25); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 159.5 tpy (-43.7); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 113.9 tpy (-58.6); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 2.1 tpy (-0.7), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 2.1 tpy (-0.7); and greenhouse gas (CO₂e) 50,427 tpy.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 50, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77 and 82; 40 CFR 60 Subparts JJJJ and OOOOa; 40 CFR 63 Subparts HH and ZZZZ; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on August 17, 2024.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
