Air Quality Operating Permit for Jal No. 3 Gas Plant of ET Gathering & Processing, LLC

ET Gathering & Processing, LLC at 2564 Pecos Highway, Carlsbad, NM 88220 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Jal No. 3 Gas Plant. The owner of this plant is ET Gathering & Processing, LLC. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 32.173611, -103.174167 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 4 miles north-northeast of Jal in Lea County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P090R4 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 569.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of the facility is a natural gas treating and processing plant.

This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves the removal of ten (10) natural gas compressor engines, two (2) heaters, two (2) boilers, one (1) glycol dehydrator, one (1) thermal oxidizer, and supporting equipment. Two (2) Caterpillar 3606 engines, one (1) 28 MMBtu/hr amine system heater, one (1) glycol dehydration unit with associated reboiler and thermal oxidizer, one (1) AGI compressor, and (1) 10 MMBtu/hr condensate stabilizer heater will be added.

The emissions as established in NSR Permit 1092M10R3 and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit P090R3M1. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 123.1 tpy (-520.3 tpy); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 125.3 tpy (-905.9 tpy); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 180.9 tpy (-41.2 tpy); Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 201.0 tpy (-1,175.3 tpy); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 7.2 tpy (-31.2 tpy), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 7.2 tpy (-31.2 tpy); and greenhouse gas (CO₂e) > 75,000 tpy.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this plant will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 1, 7, 35, 50, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 75, 77, and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, Dc, JJJJ, OOOO, and OOOOa; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A, HH, and ZZZZ; 40 CFR 64; 40 CFR 68; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before November 21, 2024.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
