Air Quality Operating Permit  
for Lordsburg Compressor Station of El Paso Natural Gas Company, LLC

El Paso Natural Gas Company, LLC at 2 N Nevada Ave; Colorado Springs, CO 80903 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Lordsburg Compressor Station. The owner of this plant is El Paso Natural Gas Company, LLC. The exact location of the facility is/will be at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 32.316389, -108.606111 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 3 mi ESE of Lordsburg in Hidalgo County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P131-R5 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 553.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation.

The main purpose of the facility is to compress natural gas for delivery to the pipelines for mainline transportation.

This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves no physical changes to the facility. The facility voluntarily removed Malfunction emission from the permit.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit PSD2810-M5 and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit – P131-R4. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NO<sub>x</sub>) at 731.2 tpy (No change); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 169.1 tpy (No change); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 19.5 tpy (-7); Sulfur Dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>) at 9.2 tpy (No change); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM<sub>10</sub>) at 12.3 tpy (No change), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM<sub>2.5</sub>) at 12.3 tpy (No change); and greenhouse gas (CO<sub>2</sub>e) 171,761 tpy.

There are no changes to the existing air emission limits in this permitting action.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 50, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 77 and 82; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A and GG; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A and ZZZZ; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before December 3, 2024.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and

the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
