<u>Air Quality Operating Permit</u> for Brininstool Compressor Station of Targa Midstream Services LLC

Targa Midstream Services LLC at 811 Louisiana Suite 2100; Houston, TX 77002 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Brininstool Compressor Station. The owner of this plant is Targa Midstream Services LLC. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 32.300228, -103.540425 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 23.6 mi SW of Eunice in Lea County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P276-R1 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 35592.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation.

The main purpose of the facility is to compress natural gas for transport.

This operating permit application is for a new permit. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves incorporation of a issued NSR permit 6317-M3.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 6317-M3 and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 120.4 tpy (no change); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 101.2 tpy (no change); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 74.8 tpy (-10.9); Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 2.47 tpy (no change); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 11.85 tpy (no change), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 11.85 tpy (no change); Hydrogen Sulfide (H2S) at 0.39 tpy (-1.71) and greenhouse gas (CO₂e) 80,808 tpy.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 50, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77 and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, JJJJ and OOOOa; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A and ZZZZ; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before November 28, 2024.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
