Air Quality Operating Permit  
for South Carlsbad Compressor Station of Enterprise Field Services, LLC

Enterprise Field Services, LLC at PO Box 4324; Houston, TX 77210-4324 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its South Carlsbad Compressor Station. The owner of this plant is Enterprise Field Services, LLC. The exact location of the facility is/will be at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 32.313828, -104.137132 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 2.8 mi NW of Loving in Eddy County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P130R4M1 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 218.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of the facility is to compress and transport natural gas down the pipeline.

This operating permit application is for a permit modification. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, involving the incorporation of NSR 0220M13 consisting of the following: increasing the facility wide gas throughput, and addition of new equipment including one (1) Caterpillar G3608 compressor engine (Unit 11), four (4) Caterpillar G3612 compressor engines (Units 12 through 15), one (1) slop oil storage tank (Unit TK-1000), updating compressor blowdowns (emissions directed to Unit Flare (SSM) for combustion), and facility wide fugitive emissions. The increased emissions and addition of these units make the facility major for PSD.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 0220-M13 and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit – P130M4. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NO<sub>x</sub>) at 307.4 tpy (+96.1); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 196.3 tpy (+113.6); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 302.4 tpy (+160.1); Sulfur Dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>) at 20.8 tpy (+3.8); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM<sub>10</sub>) at 15.4 tpy (+8.7), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM<sub>2.5</sub>) at 15.4 tpy (+8.7); and greenhouse gas (CO<sub>2</sub>e) > 75,000 tpy.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 1, 7, 50, 61, 20, 71, 72, 73, 74, 77, 82; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, GG, JJJ, OOOOa, OOOOb, OOOOc; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A, HH, ZZZZ; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before April 5, 2025.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and

the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
