Legal Notice For <u>Air Quality Operating Permit</u> for Wingate Facility of Western Refining Terminals LLC - Gallup

Western Refining Terminals LLC - Gallup at 92 Giant Crossing Road; Gallup, NM 87301 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Wingate Facility. The owner of this plant is Western Refining Terminals LLC - Gallup. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 35.535556, -108.639611 Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 6 miles east of Gallup in McKinley County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P117R4 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 884.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of the facility is to receive isobutane/normal butane/mixed butane in railcars. The railcars are pressurized using purchased natural gas. Isobutane/normal butane/mixed butane is unloaded from railcar to storage tanks. During offloading, the storage tanks are vented to the flare. Isobutane/normal butane/mixed butane storage is sent via pipeline to the Gallup refinery.

This operating permit application is for a permit renewal. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves renewal of the operating permit only for equipment current installed and operating.

The estimated maximum air pollutant emissions to the atmosphere, from this facility after the requested operating permit is issued, are as follows: Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 3.5 tpy (+3.5); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 4.3 tpy (+4.3); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 145.1 tpy (+3.5). The facility is a minor source of greenhouse gas emissions, < 100,000 tpy CO_2e .

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 1, 7, 61, 70, 71, 73, 74, 77 and 82; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, NNN, RRR, and IIII; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A and ZZZZ and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before June 21, 2025.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
