## <u>Air Quality Operating Permit</u> for 31-6 CDP Compressor Station of Harvest Four Corners LLC

Harvest Four Corners LLC at 1755 Arroyo Dr; Bloomfield, NM 87413 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its 31-6 CDP Compressor Station. The owner of this plant is Harvest Four Corners LLC. The exact location of the facility is at latitude and longitude decimal degrees: 36.83, -107.42 Datum: NAD83. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 15.4 miles East of Navajo Dam in Rio Arriba County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P027R5M3 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 1006.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation.

The main purpose of the facility is to compress natural gas for the purpose of transportation to another facility or a major transportation pipeline.

This operating permit application is for a TV significant permit modification Per 20.2.70.404.C NMAC. This modification incorporates construction permit PSD1031M10 and consists of replacing four (4) of the existing four-stroke lean burn engines with four-stroke rich burn engines and these new four-stroke engines will have three-way catalysts installed to control emissions. All other existing four-stroke lean burn engines will have oxidation catalysts installed to reduce emissions. Three 30 MMscfd dehydrators will be added to the facility. Because catalysts are being added to all engines, total facility emissions will be decreasing to below 250 tpy thresholds per prevention of significant deterioration (PSD) levels, hence this facility will no longer be a PSD size facility.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit PSD1031M10 and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit – P027R5. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 173.2 tpy (-18.8); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 65.1 tpy (-235.6); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 133.9 tpy (-80.3); Sulfur Dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>) at 0.5 tpy (+.1); Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM<sub>10</sub>) at 9.4 tpy (+2.2), and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM<sub>2.5</sub>) at 9.4 tpy (+2.2); and greenhouse gas (CO<sub>2</sub>e) > 75,000 tpy.

There are no changes to the existing air emission limits in this permitting action.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 1, 7, 50 (Rio Arriba), 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77, and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, JJJJ, OOOOa; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A, HH, and ZZZZ; 40 CFR 64; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is, to issue the air quality operating permit on or before August 17, 2025.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P027R5M3 by contacting Jordan Moore at the New Mexico

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
