

# Notice of Public Review Draft, Public Comment Period, and Informational Meeting

2026 Triennial Review of New Mexico's Water Quality Standards (20.6.4 NMAC)

The New Mexico Environment Department's (NMED) Surface Water Quality Bureau (SWQB) invites the public to comment on NMED's proposed amendments to the State's Standards for Interstate and Intrastate Surface Waters, 20.6.4 New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC). The 60-day public comment period for the proposed amendments begins August 15, 2025 and closes October 14, 2025.

Please note that comments submitted to NMED SWQB on the Public Review Draft are for further developing the proposed amendments prior to petitioning the Water Quality Control Commission for a rulemaking hearing. An additional public comment period will be held in conjunction with the rulemaking hearing pursuant to 20.1.6.204(B) NMAC.

## Background

It is the objective of the federal Clean Water Act (CWA) to restore and maintain the chemical, physical, and biological integrity of the nation's waters, including those in New Mexico. As part of upholding the objective of the CWA, the State of New Mexico is required by statute to adopt water quality standards that protect the public health or welfare and enhance the quality of water, and are consistent with and serve the purposes of the New Mexico Water Quality Act (WQA) and the federal CWA. New Mexico's surface water quality standards are codified under 20.6.4 NMAC.

In accordance with Section 303(c)(1) of the CWA and 20.6.4.10 NMAC, States are required to hold public hearings at least once every three years to review, amend, and adopt water quality standards, as applicable. This is referred to as a "Triennial Review." Pursuant to Section 74-6-4(F) of the WQA, the Water Quality Control Commission (WQCC) delegated NMED the responsibility for organizing and proposing amendments to the state's surface water quality standards.

The last Triennial Review of the state's surface water quality standards was approved by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency in January 2023. Therefore, NMED is initiating the current Triennial Review process by providing NMED's proposed amendments to the public for comment. NMED intends to consider public comments and petition the WQCC by the end of 2025 for a hearing in the second half of 2026.
