<u>NEW MEXICO ENVIRONMENT DEPARTMENT'S</u> NOTICE OF INTENT TO PRESENT TECHNICAL TESTIMONY

Pursuant to 20.1.6.202(A) NMAC and the October 15, 2024, Pre-Hearing Order, the Surface Water Quality Bureau within the Water Protection Division of the New Mexico Environment Department (Department) files this Notice of Intent to Present Technical Testimony for the hearing in this matter currently scheduled for December 10th and 11th, 2024.
