Senate Bill 21



- Senate Bill 21 was passed during the 2025
 Legislative Session.
- Signed into law by Governor Lujan Grisham on April 8, 2025.
- Protects the state's surface and ground water resources.
- Gives New Mexico control over its water resources in two ways:
 - Amends the Water Quality Act
 - Creates the New Mexico Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NMPDES) Act to allow the Environment Department to implement the federal NPDES permitting program in New Mexico




Scope of Permitting Program



- □ Waters of the U.S. (Clean Water Act)
 - Seek delegation from EPA for the NPDES program for point source discharges
 - Do not seek authorization for the Section 404 discharge program: U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will continue to regulate discharges of dredged and fill materials to waters of the U.S.
- □ Surface waters of the state (Water Quality Act)
 - Create a State program that covers both point source discharges and discharges of dredged and fill materials in surface waters of the state
 - The program will not apply to tribal waters, but NMED will be responsive to tribal concerns

Surface Water Advisory Panel (SWAP)





- Provided technical information, practical considerations,
 and policy perspectives from a wide range of stakeholders.
- Moderator ensured all SWAP participants had an opportunity to provide input.
- NMED posted SWAP meeting agendas, presentations, and meeting notes on its <u>website</u>.
- □ SWAP input & recommendations helped refine draft rule.



Next Step - Rulemaking

New -- 20.6.5 NMAC New Mexico Pollutant Discharge Elimination System

- Implements the New Mexico Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Act.
- Applies to all persons who discharge a pollutant from a point source to a water of the United States.

Amended -- 20.6.2 NMAC Ground and Surface Water Protection

- Implements the Water Quality Act amendments in Senate Bill 21 related to a state-led surface water permitting program.
- Applies to persons who discharge from a point source or who discharge dredged or fill material to a surface water of the State.
- Protect surface waters of the State (SWOTS) using practical and common-sense approach to ensure clean water for all uses.
- Allow New Mexico to protect water quality regardless of what is happening at the federal level.

- Regulations specify requirements for pre-hearing procedures, petitions for regulatory changes, hearing notices, hearing participation, post-hearing actions, and appeals.
- Additional requirements in State's Water Quality
 Management Plan and Continuing Planning Process.



Next Step – Rulemaking Timeline

- May 2025: NMED provided draft permitting rules to the Surface Water Advisory Panel and Tribal Environmental Directors.
- August 2025: Public review draft rules announced.
- August October 2025: Outreach and engagement with the public and New Mexico's Nations, Pueblos, & Tribes.
- October 2025: Public review and comment period closes.
- October November 2025: Incorporate comments into the draft rules.
- December 2025: Petition Water Quality Control Commission to request rulemaking hearing to be held in the spring or early summer of 2026.

20.6.5.101 NMAC – Permitting Prohibitions and Requirements


A. No person shall discharge a pollutant to a water of the United States from a point source without a permit ...

20.6.5.102 Permit Not Required

- A. Return flows from irrigated agriculture;
- B. Certain stormwater discharges from mining operations and oil and gas; or
- C. Certain forestry activities conducted in accordance with standard industry practice.

20.6.5.401 ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS:					
A. The secretary shall review an application for administrative completeness.					
B. To be deemed administratively complete, an application and any required reports					
shall:					
(1) be complete and in the format specified by the department;					
(2) for a new or renewed permit, provide the information required by 40					
C.F.R. § <u>122.21;</u>					
(3) for a modification, provide the supporting facts and reasons required by 40					
C.F.R. § <u>124.5(a)</u> ;					
(4) meet the signatory and certification requirements of 40 C.F.R. §					
122.22; and					
(5) include the applicable fee.

20.6.5.302 NMAC – General Permits

- A. The secretary may issue or renew a general permit for one or more categories or subcategories of discharges... within a geographic area... for either:
 - 1) storm water point sources; or
 - 2) other point sources or TWTDS if all of the sources in the category or subcategory satisfy 40 C.F.R. § 122.28(a)(2).



20.6.5.303 NMAC – General Permit Coverage

- A. Notice of Intent for general permit coverage.
- B. The Department shall maintain a list of general permit coverages.
- C. Transfers of general permit coverage.
- D. Terminations.
- E. If a general permit is not renewed before it expires, the general permit shall continue and a permittee who has general permit coverage shall continue to comply with the general permit...
- F. Individual Permit Required



20.6.5.401 NMAC – Administrative Completeness

- A. The secretary shall review an application for administrative completeness.
- B. Requirements to be deemed administratively complete
- C. Within 60 days of receipt of an application, the department will determine whether the application is administratively complete.



20.6.5.402 NMAC – Processing

20.6.5.402 PROCESSING:

- A. The secretary shall process an administratively complete application...
- B. The secretary may request additional information...
- C. The department may conduct an inspection of the site...
- D. In appropriate cases the department may consult with any state or federal agency or tribal government with jurisdiction over water, fish, wildlife, or public health, before issuing a draft permit and may reflect their views in the statement of basis, the fact sheet, or the draft permit, in accordance with 40 C.F.R. 124.59(c).



20.6.5.403 NMAC – Draft Permits, Notices of Intent to Deny the Application, and Notices of Intent to Terminate the Permit

20.6.5.404 NMAC – Public Notice & Participation

- A. Within 90 days after the... administrative completeness determination... the department shall make available a draft permit or a notice of intent to deny an application...
- B. The **department** ...shall provide to the public notice of the draft permit or the notice of intent to deny the application, fact sheet, statement of basis, or new source or new discharger determination...
- C. The applicant shall provide notice to the public of the draft permit...
- D. Notice requirements
- E. The applicant shall provide proof of their notice to the department.



20.6.5.405 NMAC – Public Comments and Requests for Public Hearing

20.6.5.406 NMAC – Public Hearings

- A. Requests for a hearing shall be in writing and shall state the nature of the issues to be raised in the hearing.
- B. A public hearing shall be held if the secretary determines there is a significant degree of public interest, a tribal government has raised a significant issue, or the department, in its discretion, determines that a hearing may clarify a relevant issue...



20.6.5.407 NMAC - Final [Secretary] Actions

B. Within 45 days after the draft permit is provided for the secretary's review... the secretary shall take final action...

20.6.2.2303 NMAC – Exemptions

- A. Point source discharge exemptions same as 20.6.5 NMAC, with the addition of:
 - 4) Discharges and water contaminants that are subject to effective and enforceable surface water quality requirements in a state or federally issued permit...
- B. Dredge or fill discharge exemptions identical to the Clean Water Act exemptions, with the addition of:
 - 6) Discharges and water contaminants that are subject to effective and enforceable surface water quality requirements in a state or federally issued permit...



20.6.2.2304 NMAC - Individual Permits

- **A C.** Application requirements.
- **D.** Existing permits (permit renewals).
- **E.** The department may conduct an inspection of the facility, discharge site, or project site, including the collection and analysis of samples, data, and other information, for the purpose of evaluating the application.



20.6.2.2305 NMAC – General Permits (GP)

- A. The secretary may issue, modify, renew, or terminate a GP...
- B. Categories of GPs...
- C. Requirements to be included in a GP...
- D. If a GP is not renewed before it expires, the GP shall continue...

20.6.2.2306 NMAC – General Permit (GP) Coverage

- A. Notice of Intent for GP coverage.

- C. A person who fails to submit an NOI/PCN is not authorized to discharge.
- D. The Department shall maintain a list of GP coverages.

- **E.** The following conditions apply to all surface water discharge permits...
- F. The following conditions apply to point source discharges...
- G. The following conditions apply to discharges of dredge of fill material...
- H. Compensatory mitigation...



20.6.2.2308 NMAC – Public Notice & Participation

- **A.** Within 60 days of receipt of an application... the department shall review the application for administrative completeness...
- **B.** Within 90 days... the department shall make available a draft permit or a notice of intent to deny an application... The draft permit shall include all proposed effluent limitations or other conditions, and all proposed monitoring, recordkeeping, and reporting requirements.
- **D.** The **department**... shall provide to the public notice of the draft permit or the notice of intent to deny...
- **E.** Concurrent with the department's notice... the **applicant**... shall provide notice to the public of the draft permit...
- **H.** Following the public notice... and prior to a final decision... there shall be a period of at least 30 days during which... a public hearing may be requested... Requests for a hearing... shall set forth the reasons why a hearing should be held. A public hearing shall be held if the secretary determines there is substantial public interest or a tribal government has raised a significant issue.



20.6.2.2309 NMAC - Secretary Review and Approval

- B. The secretary shall, within 45 days after the draft permit is provided for review... approve or deny the draft discharge permit, modification, or renewal based on the administrative record.
- E. The secretary shall deny a surface water discharge permit if:
- (1) the discharge would not comply with applicable effluent limitations or standards;
- (2) the discharge does not include all appropriate and practicable measures to avoid and minimize potential harm to the aquatic resources;
- (3) the discharge would cause or contribute to an exceedance of a water quality standard in or violate any requirement of 20.6.4 NMAC Standards for Interstate and Intrastate Surface Waters;
- (4) the discharge would cause or contribute to an exceedance of a downstream state or tribal water quality standard; or
 - (5) The discharge would violate any requirement of state or federal law;

1. Application Fee:

base fee + (design flow x size factor)

Ex #1: "Major" facility with design flow of 5,500,000 Gal/Day

Fee = $$5,000 + (500,000 \times 0.0025) +$

\$21,160 (cap) = **\$27,410**

Ex #2: "Minor" facility with design flow of 350,000 Gal/Day Fee = \$2,000 + (100,000 x 0.008) + \$2,410 = \$5,210

2. Annual Fee:

base fee + [(design flow x size factor) x 4.2]

Ex #1: "Major" facility with design flow of 5,500,000 Gal/Day

Fee = $$5,000 + ([(500,000 \times 0.0025) + $21,160 (cap)] \times 4.2) = $99,122$

Ex #2: "Minor" facility with design flow of 350,000 Gal/Day Fee = $$2,000 + ([(100,000 \times 0.008) + $2,410] \times 4.2) = $15,482$

Fee Calculations (Individual Permits)

Industrial Wastewater

1. Application Fee: (base fee x complexity factor) + [(number of outfalls -1) x base fee x complexity factor x constant]

Ex #1: Simple "major" with 2 outfalls

Fee = [\$6,500 x Complexity Factor (1.0)] + (1 x \$6,500 x 1.0 x 1.3) = **\$14,950**

Ex #2: Complex "minor" with 5 outfalls

Fee = [\$3,500 x Complexity Factor (2.5)] + (4 x \$3,500 x 2.5 x 1.3) = \$54,250

Ex #3: Complex "major" with 11 outfalls

Fee = $[\$6,500 \times \text{Complexity Factor} (5.0)] + (10 \times \$6,500 \times 5.0 \times 1.3) =$

\$455,000

Fee Calculations (Individual Permits)

Industrial Wastewater

2. Annual Fee: (number of outfalls +1) x base fee

Ex #1: Simple "major" with 2 outfalls

Fee = $3 \times \$7,000 = \$21,000$

Ex #2: Complex "minor" with 5 outfalls

Fee = $6 \times $3,500 = $21,000$

Ex #3: Complex "major" with 11 outfalls

Fee = $12 \times \$7,000 = \$84,000$
