NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Description of the Requested Action: The New Mexico Environment Department (“Department”) will hold a public hearing to consider the matter of the application by Northwest New Mexico Regional Solid Waste Authority (“Applicant”) for renewal of the Cibola County Transfer Station (“Transfer Station”) permit. The applicant is seeking to renew the existing solid waste facility permit. The permit renewal application was initially submitted to the Department on April 6, 2015.

Hearing Date, Time, and Location: The hearing will begin at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, June 29, 2016 at the Milan Village Hall, 623 Uranium Avenue, Milan, New Mexico. Public comment will be taken starting at 5:30 p.m. on June 29 and as additionally determined by the Hearing Officer. The hearing may continue on the following day(s) as determined by the Hearing Officer. In lieu of verbal public comments, written statements may be submitted for the record at, or prior to, the hearing.

The application for a solid waste facility permit renewal has been reviewed by the Department for compliance with the New Mexico Solid Waste Act (“Act”), and the New Mexico Solid Waste Rules, 20.9.2 to 20.9.10 NMAC. The Department deemed the application complete on April 14, 2016. The Secretary of Environment shall issue, issue with conditions, or deny solid waste facility permits in accordance with the Act. The Secretary of Environment considers all public comments, including issues relating to public health and welfare, in his decision to issue, issue with conditions, or deny the permit.

Anticipated Start-Up Date of Facility Modification and Hours of Operation:

(a) Anticipated Start-Up Date: The Transfer Station is an existing solid waste facility. Permit no. SWM-331102 was issued in January 1996.

(b) Hours of Operation: The Transfer Station’s operating hours are 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday. The Transfer Station is open to the public for waste acceptance 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday. The Transfer Station is closed on Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year’s Day.

Description of the Facility:

(a) Location and Size: The Transfer Station is located at 2305 West U.S. Highway 66/NM Highway 568 in Milan, NM. The facility is located in Section 6, Township 11N, Range10W, NMPM. The facility property is 10.35 acres in size.

- (b) General Process: The Transfer Station currently receives municipal solid waste (including construction and demolition debris), tires, and select recyclable materials (scrap metal/white goods, aluminum cans, mixed paper, cardboard, plastic, electronic waste, brush/green waste, used oil, and vehicle lubricants) from commercial haulers and the public. Municipal solid waste is unloaded onto the tipping floor. Heavy equipment is used to push the waste into the loading hopper. A transfer trailer is located beneath the loading hopper to receive the waste. Waste is transported to Red Rocks Regional Landfill for disposal. Recyclable materials are directed to their respective storage areas at the facility. Most of the recyclable materials (scrap metal/white goods, aluminum cans, mixed paper, cardboard, and plastic) are transported to Red Rocks Regional Landfill for further processing. Electronic waste and used oil/lubricants are transported to off-site processing facilities. Brush/green waste is mulched and beneficially used at the facility or given to the public.
- (c) Quantity and Rate of Solid Waste: The Transfer Station received approximately 16,100 tons of solid waste and recyclables in 2015, or approximately 52 tons of solid waste and recyclables per operating day.
- (d) Types of Solid Waste: The Transfer Station accepts municipal solid waste (including construction and demolition debris), tires, and select recyclable materials (scrap metal/white goods, aluminum cans, mixed paper, cardboard, plastic, electronic waste, brush/green waste, used oil, and vehicle lubricants).

Origin of Waste: Waste received at the Transfer Station originates from the Village of Milan, the City of Grants, and other areas of Cibola County.

Hearing Procedures: The public hearing will be conducted in accordance with the Permit Procedures of the Environment Department (20.1.4 NMAC), which may be obtained at no charge from the Hearing Clerk, Linda Vigil, P.O. Any person may speak at the public hearing or submit general written comments without filing any documents beforehand. However, a person wishing to be an interested party or present technical testimony at the hearing must file an Entry of Appearance or Statement of Intent to Present Technical Testimony with the Hearing Clerk and serve it upon other parties of record, on or before 5:00 p.m., Wednesday, June 15, 2016. Technical testimony means scientific, engineering, economic or other specialized testimony, whether oral or written, but does not include legal argument, general comments or statements of policy concerning matters at issue in the hearing.

In accordance with 20.1.4 NMAC, the Statement of Intent to Present Technical Testimony shall:

- a) identify the person filing the statement;
- b) state whether the person filing the statement supports or opposes the application;
- c) identify each witness, including name, address, affiliation(s), and educational and work background;
- d) estimate how long the direct testimony of each witness will take;
- e) identify all exhibits that are part of the Record Proper and, for exhibits not part of the Record Proper, attach a copy;
- f) list or make available all technical materials relied upon by each witness in making each statement of technical fact or opinion contained in his or her direct testimony; and
- g) attach a summary of the testimony of each witness, stating any opinion(s) to be offered by such witness, and an explanation of the basis for such opinion(s).

To promote efficiency and fairness, and to avoid prejudice and surprise, a person's direct technical testimony at the hearing shall be limited to the data, views and arguments raised in that person's filed Statement of Intent.

Submittal of a Statement of Intent to Present Technical Testimony shall also be considered an Entry of Appearance.
