This is an emergency amendment to 11.5.1 NMAC, Section 16 effective 08/05/2020

Explanatory note: The New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) will issue a temporary emergency a mendment which will be effective for 120 days. The temporary emergency a mendment is in response to the current state of public health emergency regarding COVID-19. The rule is being a mended to a void causing an imminent peril to the public health, sa fety or welfare. This temporary emergency rulemaking does not permanently a mend or repeal the existing rule. The emergency amendment will only remain in effect for 120 days following the effective date unless a permanent rule takes effect under the normal rule making process.

11.5.1.16 RECORDKEEPING AND REPORTING OCCUPATIONAL INJURIES, ILLNESSES AND FATALITIES:

- **A. General:** Except as otherwise provided in Subsection B of this section, the provisions of 29 CFR Part 1904, Recording and Reporting Occupational Injuries and Illnesses (internet: www.osha.gov), are hereby incorporated into this section.
- **B.** Exception: Work-related injuries, illnesses and fatalities which are required to be reported by 29 CFR Part 1904.39 shall be reported, by <a href="mailto:email.com/email.c
- C. Reporting COVID-19 cases: Within four (4) hours of learning that an employee tested positive for coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19), each employer shall report the positive test to the bureau at the email, telephone or facsimile number specified in Subsection B of this section.
