Free annual Four Corners Air Quality Group meeting will focus on regional air and climate challenges

In-person and online meeting taking place in Durango on November 7-8, 2023.

DURANGO, C.O. — The Four Corners Air Quality Group is hosting its annual meeting on November 7 and 8 at La Plata County Fairgrounds and Event Center. The meeting will be in-person with the option of participating virtually online. The meeting will offer updates on climate and air quality issues affecting the region. The first day will focus on climate actions and lessons learned. The second day will focus on air quality monitoring trends.

Originally convened as the “Four Corners Air Quality Task Force” over a decade ago, the group meets regularly to provide updates on air quality topics relevant to the region. The states of New Mexico and Colorado oversee the group with additional participating agencies including the Navajo Nation EPA; Southern Ute Indian Tribe’s Air Quality Program; U.S. Environmental Protection Agency; U.S. Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management and National Park Service; U.S. Department of Agriculture, Forest Service; the U.S. Department of Energy; and the state of Utah.
