Environment Department Issues “Boil Water Advisory” for Morningstar Water System

Users Are Urged to Boil Water Prior to Drinking

Santa Fe –The New Mexico Environment Department’s Drinking Water Bureau issued a “boil water advisory” for the Morningstar Water System of Farmington, New Mexico.

NMED issued the advisory on June 3, 2016 after high turbidity levels were detected. NMED required Morningstar Water System to notify water system consumers of this finding.

Morningstar Water System is a community public water system that serves approximately 6,423 people and is located in Farmington, NM. This advisory only applies to the drinking water from the Morningstar Water System.

Consumers of the Morningstar Water System are advised to boil the water for five minutes before drinking, cooking, dishwashing and bathing. Elevated turbidity may indicate the presence of *E. coli* in water and that the water may have been in contact with sewage or animal wastes, and could contain disease-causing organisms. Most strains of *E. coli* are harmless and live in the intestines of healthy humans and animals. However, a positive test for *E. coli* in the drinking water supply may indicate the presence of dangerous strains of *E. coli* or other disease-causing organisms. These types of organisms may cause severe gastrointestinal illness and, in rare cases, death. Children, the elderly and immuno-compromised individuals are at an increased risk for illness.

The NMED Drinking Water Bureau will continue to work with the water system and Morningstar Water System will continue to test the water until no further threat of contamination remains.
