PUBLIC NOTICE Groundwater Discharge Permits Proposed for Approval June 19, 2020

Dear Interested Party,

The New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) Ground Water Quality Bureau (GWQB) hereby provides notice that the following Groundwater Discharge Permits have been proposed for approval. NMED will allow 30 days after the date of publication of this notice (or as otherwise provided below) for submittal of written comments and/or a request for a public hearing for a permitting action. Requests for public hearing shall be in writing and shall set forth the reasons why a hearing should be held. A hearing will be held if NMED determines that there is substantial public interest. After the administrative record for a permitting action is complete and all required information is available, NMED will approve, approve with conditions, or disapprove the Permit based on the administrative record.

NMED maintains a Public Involvement Plan (PIP) for each permitting action to plan for providing public participation opportunities and information that may be needed for the community to participate in a permitting process. PIPs may be viewed on-line at https://www.env.nm.gov/gwqb/public-involvement-plans/. Due to the Public Health Emergency, instead of placing a copy of the PIP for this permitting action in a public location, NMED will make the PIP available to the community by sending the PIP by email or US mail to any community member requesting a copy at no cost to the requester. An individual may request a copy of the PIP utilizing the Bureau contact information in this public notice. Please specify how you would like the document delivered. If you request a copy of a PIP, NMED will send a revised PIP if NMED updates the PIP in the future. NMED maintains facility-specific mailing lists for persons wishing to receive associated notices or provide input for a PIP for a permitting action.

<u>Notice</u>: DP-1901, Canyon Auto Groundwater Remediation Site: The New Mexico Environment Department Petroleum Storage Tank Bureau Remedial Action Program proposes to inject up to 11,075 pounds of oxygen release compound into groundwater for remediation purposes. Potential contaminants from this type of discharge include dissolved solids. The injection is proposed to occur at 843 NM 333, Tijeras, Bernalillo County. Groundwater to be remediated is at a depth of approximately 70 feet and has a total dissolved solids concentration of 872 milligrams per liter.
