Air Quality Operating Permit for Brininstool Compressor Station of Versado Gas Processors, LLC

Versado Gas Processors, LLC at 6 Desta Drive, Suite 3300; Midland, TX 79705 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Brininstool Compressor Station. The owner of this plant is Versado Gas Processors, LLC. The exact location of the facility is at latitude 32 deg, 18 min, 0.82 sec and longitude -103 deg, 32 min, 25.5 sec, Datum: WGS84. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 20 miles SW of Eunice in Lea County, NM. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P276 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 35592.

Previously, the facility received an air quality construction permit and is in operation. The main purpose of the facility is to compress, dehydrate, and move natural gas between the gathering system and gas processing plant.

This operating permit application is for a new Title V permit. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves incorporating applicable requirements from construction permit 6317-M1. The Title V permit will also include provisions for Compliance Assurance Monitoring (CAM) for the dehydration unit and some of the engines.

The emissions, were established in Construction Permit 6317-M1, and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) at 59.8 tpy; Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 159.2 tpy; Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 55.2 tpy; Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 109.3 tpy; Total Suspended Particulate Matter (TSP) at 7.8 tpy; Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 7.8 tpy, Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 7.8 tpy; hydrogen sulfide (H2S) at 11.2 tpy; and greenhouse gas (CO₂e) < 75,000 tpy.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 7, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77, and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts A, JJJJ, and OOOOa; 40 CFR 63 Subparts A, HH, and ZZZZ; and 40 CFR 64; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before December 12, 2018.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P276 by contacting Jim Nellessen at the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, 525 Camino de los Marquez Suite 1, Santa Fe, NM 87505-1816.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
